

Announcement for Poster and WIP Presentations

Poster Session

The poster session will take place on **Wednesday (7/3), from 1:20pm to 2:20pm**, in Grand Hall and the foyer area of KCCI, Basement 2.

The preferred size for LTRC 2013 Posters is **90 cm (35.5 in)** horizontal, and **120 cm (47.25 in)** vertical. This is the standard size for most international conferences.

The organizing committee, with the help of a selected vendor, is planning to install 38 wall-type poster boards for the poster presentations in Grand Hall and the foyer area on the morning of July 3. Posters can be put up during the lunch hour that day.

As a matter of fact, the poster board will be about 1 m (horizontal) wide and 2.5 meters long (vertically), so we can accommodate posters that are slightly larger, if need be. Nevertheless, the presenters should be aware that if the poster is too long, it is difficult for the audience to see things at the top and the bottom of the poster.

We apologize for any confusion about the poster size as we were working with the venue organizers to determine the most appropriate size. If you have any further questions or concerns regarding your poster, please feel free to email, and thank you for your patience.

Work-in-Progress Session

The Works-in-Progress Session is scheduled on **Friday (7/5), from 10:30am to 12:00pm**. It will take place in Conference Halls A and B on the B2 floor of KCCI. Each WIP presenter will be allocated a small table and chairs that are able to seat about 5-6 people including presenter(s). Tables will be labeled in advance with the presenter name and abstract title.

There will be a maximum of 20 WIP presenters, i.e. 8-12 tables in each of the two adjacent conference halls (A&B). As far as possible, presenters will be grouped in each room according to topic/theme. Names and abstract titles will also be listed on the Lecture Room door.

Presenters are expected to:

- Sit down at an assigned table and wait for others with similar interests to join them;
- Present briefly their research-in-progress or the work that is being planned;
- Use handouts and other means to explain their research work, if need be;
- Allow some time to interact with the audience and to receive comments and suggestions on how best to proceed with further research.

Session Chairs will:

- Assist presenters with getting settled at their tables;
- Start the WIP Session at 10:30 by ringing the small bell provided;
- Ring the bell once at intervals of about 15 minutes to indicate that people can move on to another WIP, i.e. at 10:45am, at 11:00am, at 11:15, and at 11:30 (this means people can attend 5 WIPs, with 3 minutes allowed for movement between WIPs);
- Ring the bell once more at 12:00 pm to close the WIP Session.
